

A Walk for Kenya

MORE than £5,000 has been raised from a nine-mile walk to advance the education of children in Manderu, Kenya.

Well over £1,200 of that was raised in sponsorship by Nur Ibrahim's colleagues at Stamford Brook and Shepherd's Bush garages.

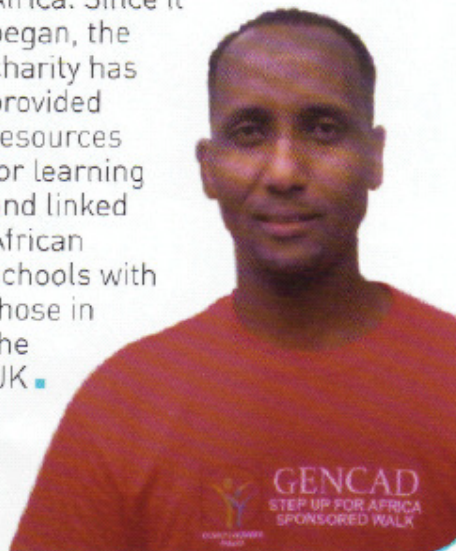
"I would like to thank everyone who contributed, and thanks specially to Service Controller Jackie Wilder for her help" said the Stamford Brook Service Controller.

The walk from Little Venice to Limehouse took place in the summer and was so successful that Nur is planning to hold a similar event every year.

Nur came to this country from Somalia ten years ago and in 2003 launched a charity with a number of influential friends, including teachers, doctors and lawyers.

They called their charity Generation for Change and Development (Gencad) with the aim of advancing the education of vulnerable youngsters in East Africa. Since it began, the charity has provided resources for learning and linked African schools with those in the UK.
